BMW Meets Art Deco

The Restoration of the Appalachian Theatre



In 1938 The Appalachian Theatre in Boone, NC was opened for business (apptheatre.org) in a community of 2500 residents, the new theatre was built to accommodate 998 patrons. Basically in two and one half days of running a film, everyone in the county could see the current running movie. If the theatre was built to hold 1000 people, a different tax would have come into effect so the style visionaries were also business savvy and planned accordingly.

In the last 84 years the Appalachian Theatre has seen a lot of history, a lot of changes, and a lot of wear and tear. The \$10 million dollar renovation budget has been well spent and has now added a returning piece of history to the old historic part of downtown Boone, NC. Don't just think movies, which do run, but also music, drama, dance, and other events.

The mind tickler of an art deco building in the mountains of North Carolina makes one pause and 12 TARHEEL CHAPTER FOOTNOTES ponder. But wait...what about the cars and is there a tie in here? Sometimes there is a combination of the BMW CCA, the cars, and more importantly the people in the club. Half of the people at the behind the scenes tour of the Appalachian Theatre that comprised our monthly meeting had connections with the theatre.

One club member Hank Thompson restored the vintage art deco lights that you see on the side walls of the theatre, since one light was unable to be located, Hank used his construction connections to have one manufactured in Atlanta.

Another member, who shall remain nameless attended the theatre in high school, on one such occasion on the way to the theatre he and some friends came across a possum, which they then put in a burlap bag, transported to the theatre and turned loose. Word has it that the possum became quite fond of popcorn.

Two other BMW CCA members attended college at http://www.tarheelbmwcca.org ASU in Boone and used to frequent the movie theatre, this was their first event with our regional chapter and we were happy to have them and their beautiful new m3.

Some of the early BMWs do evoke some Art Deco styling and influences and certainly this theatre was a stretch for the mountains of North Carolina and the design that it evoked. A big thank you to Hank Thompson for arranging this tour and also to George Antczak for a great behind the scenes tour.


From the Desk of Paul & Brenda Dunlevy
