PUSHING IT TO PARI

A rainy, yet scenic cruise to enjoy to enjoy some astronomy & meteorology

Somehow though our timing while stationary was impeccable; we managed to stay dry during ourmeetup, at our mid-drive stop on the Blue Ridge Parkway at 5600 feet, and upon arrival at PARI. Rain or shine, the views on the Parkway in the Great Balsam Mountain region are stunning. On a clear day, the peaks of the Smokey Mountains, including Clingmans Dome, can be seen 35 miles to the northwest, and on overcast, rainy days the cloud formations are a spectacle. Fortunately, socializing in the clouds, and snapping some great photos was in the cards.

Our premier group photo was set with a backdrop of one of PARI's two 26 meter radio

telescopes. PARI (pari.edu) utilizes these and other smaller telescopes and detectors for research, training, and education in astronomy and related fields. The facility opened in the 1960's as a NASA ground station to track satellites, then it was utilized by the Department of Defense in the 80's to keep an eye on our

adversaries. After several years of inactivity, PARI acquired the site and this non-profit organization began its mission.

The private tour of PARI began in the control center, where, of course, all the telescopes and instruments are operated.

Our tour guide, a PARI astrophysicist, taught us a few things: radio telescopescan operate in rain and clouds, but not in snow (M model?), and they rest pointing straight up because of wind and weight stresses (we started with the basics).

Also, they cannot detect country music transmissions (who knew?). In the NASA gallery, In the NASA gallery, many historical space travel artifacts were on display, including parts of the space shuttle. PARI owns an extensive collection of gems, minerals, and fossils, many from North Carolina, which is apparently a rich source of these items.

Both space travel and astronomy rely heavily on the study of materials, including some that shrink instead of expand when heated and therefore offer many capabilities. The meteorite gallery contained samples from the moon, mars, and many other sources. Most "meteorites" that are found on earth are actually "meteorwrongs" (they are plain ol' rocks).

However, if you are lucky enough to have a real meteorite land on your house, it's all yours. After a long day of driving and learning, and since we are in the brewery capital of America, we finished it off with brews and burgers at Oskar Blues Brewery. Among the members enjoying the beverages was one couple married 50 years and another celebrating their engagement. A BMW driving event sounds to me like a good way to celebrate!






