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# PAUL HOECKE Notes from the road Comfort Zones

Warning: Today's column may qualify as a literary example of the mission creep phenomenon I've written about before. You see, this was, initially, supposed to be a commentary about a book – well, actually not the book per se but a review – I came across the other day. But it ended up as what you are about to read: Musings by an antiquated car nut about why some of us may not be especially enamored with recent trends in automotive technology. So, let me back up a bit to where it all started.

What first caught my eye was the book's title: Where is my Flying Car? This resonated with me because (according to the reviewer) the book's author, J. Storrs Hall, is talking about the early promises of future technological marvels – things I'd read about years ago in sci-fi stories by Asimov, Clarke and Heinlein – and how (and why) some of them have materialized but others have not.

The reasons cited, pro and con, are tantalizing stuff, but I won't get into it now because, so far, I haven't read the book. What the review did trigger was thoughts about two aspects of technological innovations: (a) How they do, or don't, find their way into daily life. And (b), closer to home, why some of us BMW fans are not as ga-ga about Munich's latest, greatest offerings – be they fossil-fueled or electric (EVs) – as one might expect, preferring to spend time, energy and money on older models.

As I see it (based on my limited circle of likeminded friends) the (a) part isn't due to outright rejection of technology per se. Nor is it caused by any kind of tech-induced culture shock. After all, innovation rarely if ever spreads out, blanket-

fashion, overnight; it takes time for it to adapt to, and be adopted by, its 'target audience'. Which allows one to pick and choose what one is comfortable with.

Case in point: It has been nearly two years since my neighborhood started to show signs of the EV invasion, yet so far, that's still proceeding at a snail's pace. It started with a lone BMW i3, which makes its home about a mile away from my place. My first sighting of that weird, seemingly committee-designed shape sort of coincided with the departure of the E30 ragtop across the street when Dan, the owner, sold the house and moved away. A few months later. Ianet next door sold her E36 convertible, just about when the other house across the street was bought by people whose vehicles include a Chevy Bolt. And now there's a Tesla in the driveway two houses to my left, which has me holding my breath in anticipation of the next arrival. (Let's hope it's something interesting, like a Lucid.)

Meanwhile, I'm the only BMW guy on the block, as most of the vehicles up and down the street are still the usual assortment of late-model, non-BMW, gas or diesel-powered SUVs and pickups. I'm quite comfortable with that; or would be, were it not for the fact that all but one of my Bimmers, the Z3, are of pre-current century vintage. Which gets me, in a very roundabout way, to my other main point today: Why some of us, including Yours Truly, prefer to play with 'mature' BMWs instead of their more modern counterparts.

Perhaps the shortest answer to that question is: We not only enjoy driving BMWs but are equally enthusiastic about tinkering, and older Bimmers offer us more rewarding experiences on

both counts than what's available in showrooms today and in next year's pipeline.

Of course, some of that appeal is personal, more subjective than practical. Like for instance, the notion that there's joy in driving may be associated with any BMW, old or new, However, I'd say one feels more connected while behind the wheel of an older BMW. (Once again, I'm speaking largely for myself, but friends have felt the same.) Maybe it's the absence of nanny features, which forces you to be more alert, more conscious of everything about the car and its environment. Or maybe it is its nimbleness, which I associate (rightly or wrongly) with it being lighter than its modern cousins. Or maybe it's all of the above. At least, these are my impressions whenever I get to compare a new 3-Series loaner from the local dealership to one of my cars. And as you know, perceptions count.

Since I have yet to drive an EV, I won't comment about EVs in this context except to say that it will be quite a while before I even think of trying one out. All I know is that, given my propensity

for 500-mile road trips, I am convinced that driving one, I'd be a nervous wreck, haunted by range anxiety. Any other popular complaints about EVs – like the lack of a throaty exhaust – pale in comparison as far as I am concerned.

Ultimately though, what makes mature BMWs so appealing to some of us fans of the marque is how easy they are to work on. (Though I'm sure you've heard this before, allow me to remind you that this is what brings all those 'show cars' to events such as The Vintage.) Sure, this makes regular maintenance and basic repairs a snap for even the least experienced wrench twirler. But their real appeal comes from their relatively simple, straightforward tech makeup.

The absence of complex electronics – especially infotainment and nanny gear unrelated to a car's basic operation – makes it so much easier for anyone with a touch of Black Forest Elf in their DNA to get creative, modify a car to their heart's content and, in effect, remake it into something uniquely their own. And that, my friends, may be a car nut's ultimate Nirvana.






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# **CLUB** RACING REPORT

# Season To Kick Off Big Time at Road Atlanta, VIR

Well, fellow club racing fans. Here we go again!

As you read this, the green flag is about to fly at Road Atlanta. It will start the first race of the 2022 Tire Rack BMW CCA Club Racing (CR) season, and as far as we can tell at this point, it's turning out to be quite a start. At least, it's what we expect, the emphasis being on the term 'expect'.

Truth is (editorial deadlines being what they are) we're filing this report more than a couple of weeks before the race. So, no amount of weasel words can disguise the fact that some of what you read today about this event is probably guesswork. However, we have enough preliminary info at this point to suggest that the event will indeed live up to our expectations.

For one thing, the host, Peachtree Chapter, is reverting to their traditional, pre-pandemic event format: Three full days (March 4-6) of racing on this popular Braselton, GA track, featuring four races, an enduro Friday, a sprint race Saturday and two sprints Sunday.

Another good omen is that even now, at press time, registrations are already pushing past the forty-entry mark. At least ten of them are Tarheel Chapter racers, competing in five of the ten classes represented at the event. What's more, the local contingent includes familiar names such as C-Mod speed king Charles Harding and Sri Haputantri, our top guy in D-Modified. Both are facing their main class rivals from last season, which virtually guarantees that the weekend will see some hot contests on the 2.5-mile track.

You'll find race results and any other stuff about this event in next month's report. In the meantime, though, you – and indeed all of us in Tarheel Land – ought to be marking our calendars for an even bigger event: The spring race at VIR (April 1-3).

Cohosted annually by our chapter and the Vintage Drivers Club of America (VDCA), the race has been the Main Event hereabouts for about as long as we've been running this column. But this year's version looks like it's going to outshine any and all its predecessors in recent memory.

Overall, the weekend's format remains a familiar one: Three days of racing, slotted in between vintage run groups, with Saturday designated as Club Race Outing Day, featuring a Tarheel Chapter hospitality tent, refreshments, and lunchtime parade laps for club members and their guests. But it's the scale, especially the size of the field, that's pretty staggering.

Even now, some six weeks before the first run group hits the track, registrations already number 110 entries. As Mike Hinkley, our chapter's CR go-to guy, puts it, this could be the largest BMW CCA Club Race ever! He adds that about half of the entrants are Spec E46 racers, which may require a set of dedicated E46 races; and that he is also working on replacing the traditional Saturday afternoon enduro with two sprint races. (We like that; it no doubt will spice things up for speed-

hungry spectators.)

Meanwhile, Chapter Membership Chair Jon Strine is coordinating things with Mike on the hospitality front. He expects to have in place a pop-up tent and tables, with simple snacks and drinking water, where Outing attendees can hang out, have lunch (BYO or VIR-bought), and stage for the parade laps (weather permitting). At last report, Jon was working on the link for the electronic waivers VIR requires. (You may find his detailed announcement elsewhere in this issue.)

In short, this is an event no club racing fan can afford to miss. So, mark your calendars, and be there!
