

### **High Performance Driving School 2022 Recap**

### **Recognizing Our Amazing Students and Contributors**

It's hard to believe another year of High Performance Driving Schools (HPDS) has come to an end for Tarheel Chapter BMW CCA! Our chapter is so fortunate to have an amazing team of dedicated volunteers who organize and run these events for us. And, our drivers and instructors together make our events some of the best anywhere. Reading the evaluations we get of our event makes that observation fact, not mere opinion.

Our first school of 2022 was April 22-24, on VIR's Full Course. The weather was pretty agreeable, with temperatures in the mid-80's and bearable humidity. We had 148 students, including 12 A+ drivers. From our instructor cadre, 88 gave their time, effort, and quality coaching and guidance. VIR's Full Course is a fabulous combination of right turns, left turns, connected turns, blind turns, uphill, and downhill. It has been rated as one of the top 6 in the country by respected automotive publications, and every one of our participants got the idea!

Our summer school, the second of the year, took place on VIR's North Course. It was hot outside – VIR, after all, is in the southeast part of the country. Temperatures hovered around, and sometimes above, 90 degrees. To say our participants didn't need sweatshirts was an understatement, given the customary humidity in this part of the country! We had 72 students in attendance, including 6 A+, and 49 instructors gave their best shot at guiding drivers around the technical North Course.

We held our Instructor Training School (ITS) at this event, and we are very proud of our 8 graduates: Duncan Lauder; Rich Abraham; Aaron Nauman; Stephan Baugh; Charles Calkins; Glenn Campbell; Taylor Ward; and Paul Lippner. Kudos to our mentors who worked with these candidates and helped them to the ITS graduation podium: Steve Whitcomb; Alllen Patterson; Victor Manning; Chris Powelll; Bob Chrystler; Rob Koch; Gilbert Reynolds; and Rich Goodin. April Curtis facilitated the classroom portion of ITS. On Sunday of this school, most of the graduates picked up students to put their new instructor skills into real-world use.

We always have expectations that the weather for our fall school will be relatively kind, and our event on the Full Course, September 16-18, didn't disappoint. The humidity took a hiatus, and temps stayed in the low-to-mid 80's. We welcomed 150 students, including 13 A+. In addition, we had several racers preparing for the SCCA run-offs, not too long after this school. A good turnout of 87 instructors came to ride with students, coach them, and improve student skill levels.

Some of the notable occurrences in this event: Joyce Mitchell-Antoine ran her first event in her new-to-her 2001 BMW 330i. It was so wonderful to see Joyce out there, getting more and more comfortable. Joe Holzer, after an absence of several years joined us again in his 2007 Corvette, nearly breaking the sound barrier as he roared down the front straight. Kevin Nierle has run with us for several years, and now – to our delight – his daughter, Katelin, continued building a solid track habit in the E30 325is.

Here at Tarheel BMW CCA, we are so brilliantly supported by our HPDS team. I can't even guess the collective number of years' experience this team has – my calculator doesn't go up that high. I am happy to recognize them here and pat them all on the back for the fine job they do:

The beer was amazing, the food terrific, the atmosphere perfect after a spirited adventure. This is a place we will clearly return to at some point in the future. We are, after all, a "dining club with a driving problem!". And yes, the rains did come to wash us down on the ride home, but by that point no one really cared! This was one for creating great memories with good friends.
