# CAPE FEAR REVISITED

Stunning Views and Mountaintrail Cruises Galore



We got it started right with a rallying point at the local Starbucks, where warm beverages could be acquired in a myriad of shapes and sizes. We gradually consumed the whole of the store and the better part of the parking lot! By the time we were all organized, we had 21 cars and 40 people joining in the adventure. It is a hearty and adventurous group indeed, which included a number of folks new to the area from as far away as Maryland and California. Game on with some Old North State Hospitality.

The objective for the day's adventure on January 7th was to eventually arrive at the Cape Fear Winery in Elizabethtown and more specifically the Cork Room Restaurant. Folks came from as far away as Wilmington and Hickory for this adventure, making it an even greater chance to meet new friends and say Happy New Year to old ones. Our route completely avoided Interstate highways, costing us 17 minutes in arrival time ... but ensuring that a good time was had as we swept through farm country and forested areas in equal measure.

For fans of "Zen and the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance", this was the very essence of what Robert Persig described as the different definitions for "good time".

Elizabethtown is essentially in the middle of nowhere, on the eastern edge of the Sandhill Region, before things flatten out for a final run to the shoreline. As such, there are remarkable elevation changes to be enjoyed and stunning roads that were clearly laid out by someone from the Department of Transportation with a sense of humor. Other than the periodic encounters with slow-moving farm equipment, this meant there were good opportunities to hunt apexes and perfect cornering techniques. On the other hand, one of the local reds (Cardinal Cabernet) was more than passable for a wine to be enjoyed while sitting in rocking chairs lakeside. 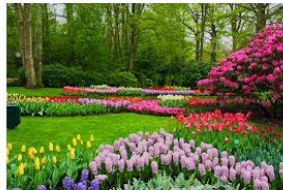

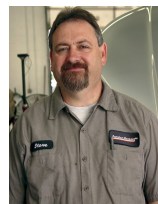

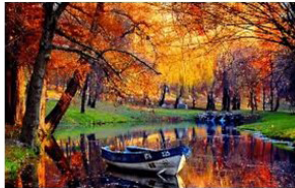
