Every New Beginning

The journey of a beloved E36 M3.



This M3 started life as a 65th birthday present from his wife for a doctor in the Hickory area. After many happy motoring years, he passed it along to a son who is a doctor in Brevard, NC. From there, it went on tours of duty with another son, then a sonin-law. He eventually concluded it wasn't a car that was appropriate for college kids or life out in the wild, at which point it came to us.

With only 99k miles on the clock, it was the perfect machine to add to a squadron that included an E30, an E46 M3, and an F87 M2. OK, in reality, we never intended to buy it. We sometimes referred to it as an "accidental" purchase, saving it from a potentially inglorious end.

For four years, it became a preferred ride for country jaunts, lead car in many BMWCCA adventures, and periodic mount for adventures at VIR to enjoy Charity Laps. It also became the subject of endless conversations and, on balance, was a joy to experience.

The Big Six, M52 engine, would happily light into a lovely and silky smooth idle, but with a deep-throated rumble that told you a thrill ride was only a single throttle blip away. Frequently referred to as the forgotten M3s, bracketed by the iconic E30/E46 variants, the reality is that the E36 is unforgettable in a very good way.

But, as the number of grandsons grew into a quartet, a change was warranted. Not that I will really grieve too much, of course. The joy they bring is a nice complement to other Bimmer action. So, with memories of hunting for the perfect line through the Oak Tree Turn and chasing the ideal burger joint/microbrewery dancing in our heads, we reluctantly put the fabled beast up for auction on Bring a Trailer.

And so began yet another new adventure! I'd never tried to do an auction before, so I carefully followed their detailed instructions. Get the pro photographer from their service catalog - check. Stay engaged in the process - check. Post more pics

and videos along the way - check. Tell stories about the storied ride - check. And it turned into a wonderful experience.

The photographer showed up, and his reaction was epic. "OMG!", he said. Turns out he's an E36 M3 lover, with a pair at home. Longest photo shoot EVER, but done with love. Once the auction started, great discussions and a bit of learning even for me. I knew it had the "luxury" package replete with interior wood trim but hadn't realized it also had some exterior nuances. One bidder described it as a "wolf in sheep's clothing" since BMW chose to tone down some of the boy racer edge found on the base model M3.



parking lot so the E36 could be put on a car carrier for the first time since Bill Clinton was President. As I rolled up, Ivan rushed over approvingly. "OMG, an OEM E36 M3 Lux Model!!!" was the reaction. "This is great!".

Then he proceeded to tell me about his E36 M3, which he had when he was a "kid." He lamented on having sold it and noted that he'd be looking for another one someday. Of course, his big question was effective, "why are you selling this?", with the implication that "you will soon regret this decision". A moment of doubt was quickly erased, however. I'd made my decision. I had great memories to enjoy and terrific stories to tell. On the trip home, I spoke to one of the grandsons whose big question was, "when am I gonna see you, Pop Pop?". Life is always Better in a Bimmer. Let's roll.

Wasserman Favorite Bimmer

Over eight-teen Bimmers acquired over the years, but only one reigns.



Urged on by our editor's plea on the back page of the February Footnotes, I'd like to tell you about my favorite BMW. Over the years, I've been very fortunate to have acquired 18 Bimmers, all new, since my first one in 1981 – a 528i. However, my favorite is a 2005 645i convertible, a titanium body color with Chateau red leather and a dark grey top, complete with European Delivery, a service BMW, unfortunately, stopped for U.S. customers in 2020. The photo does not do the car justice, but the owner never looked so good.

Arriving in Munich the day before delivery in early October 2004, I checked into my hotel downtown and headed to BMW Zentrum, company headquarters. After viewing the cars on display in the atrium, a stop in the shop yielded a miniature 645 and a München stein with roundel, which has sat on my desk ever since. I went next door to the temporary BMW museum. Fascinating as the cars on display were, I was most impressed by how Germans are taught to drive BMWs at such an early 8 TARHEEL CHAPTER FOOTNOTES

age, as evidenced by the photo taken outside the museum.

The next morning, I picked up the 645 at Kundenzentrum Freimann (Customer delivery center in Munich-Freimann), a short taxi ride from the city center. Nothing fancy, but they served a nice breakfast. This facility was closed in 2007 when the space-age, magnificent BMW Welt and Museum was built at the Munich Olympic Park, home of the tragic 1972 Summer Olympics. I did capture a photo of an early-bird arrival at the Olympic soccer stadium.

I only had a few days to tour as I had to return home to Boston to see my beloved Red Sox do battle with the Evil Empire in the glorious 2004 American League Championship Series. By returning to Fenway in time for Game 4, at least one friend gave me partial credit for presumably helping the Sox make a sui generis comeback from a 3-0 deficit in games. I spent those few days touring the Moselle Valley, visiting the sister of an old friend in Trier,

After dropping the car off in Frankfurt, I headed home to wait four weeks until my dealer called to say my car had arrived at the dealership. Taking European Delivery is an amazing experience for a car person. Having done it four times with three different margues, I highly recommend it.




