Go With The Flow



ON THE COVER:

With routes planned to the minute, and hotel, lunch and dinner reservations set we were ready and anxiously waited for the day. The attendee list was finalized at a nice sized group of 7 cars and 11 persons. The meetup location was a QuikTrip in Mooresville, NC, bright and early to allow a full day of adventure. After a brief driver's meeting, we were on the road just after 8:30. After an uneventful drive on Interstate 77 and US 21 up the mountain, we arrived at our coffee break, Becca's Backwoods Bean Coffee Shop in Sparta, NC. It's a quaint small town coffee shop also serving a variety of pastries.



We then got back on the road. Shortly after leaving town and making a few turns, heading towards Marion Virginia, I got the call. Mary had a flat tire. Our sweeper Bob Atkinson would stay behind and assist. We turned off the main highway and found a small gravel lot to sit and wait. Unfortunately, there was no cell service, and we were too far apart for our handheld radios to work. Someone volunteered to backtrack, update the status for us and assist with a can of Fix-A-Flat if needed. He took an FM band radio with him. The FM band radio worked, and we were updated with the bad news. No spare and a blown run-flat sidewall, the

flatbed was on its way, and we should continue. They would catch up later in the day.



My navigation routed us down the side road we were on, not knowing it became a one lane backroad but at least there were beautiful farms and all manner of country homes along the way. We made it into Marion, VA, and stopped for gas. I also called our lunch location to alert them of our delay and reduced count. As we continued, my navigation wanted me to turn left. But I knew right away that was the wrong street!!! It had tried to route me to Abingdon, not the Back of the Dragon. I got it corrected and we took back streets and finally got on route 16, Back of the Dragon, only to be stuck behind a Chevy Blazer going 10 under the speed limit on the straights! Once past him it was clear sailing for a while, testing the famed BMW agility on the tightest of corners. It was a busy beautiful day with many groups of motorcycles along the route. Once in town, we hit a detour, but easily found our lunch stop, Old VA Smokehouse in Tazwell, Virginia.



We were quickly seated, and the waitress took our drink orders. They even could switch to my game on the TV, NC State Super Regional Baseball, just starting. With our food orders taken, they advised the kitchen was behind, it could be a while. I then got a text that 4 more folks were on their way! Finally, our food arrived and surprise, Mary made it to our lunch! A correct tire was found in Sparta and she was back on the road, taking a faster route into Tazwell! By the time we were all finished, and paid for our meals, the game was over, a 2 ½ hour lunch!



We then decided to take the direct route into Abingdon, 4 lane all the way, route 460, to 19, to 58 and arrived at the hotel at 5pm. Watch out for the bear! He crossed the highway right in front of me. Too fast for my camera.

The Martha Washington Inn & Spa was originally built as a residence in 1832. It then became a prestigious school for women, The Matha Washington College or just known as The Martha. It survived the Civil War used as a hospital and became a hotel sometime later, first for use by the Barter Theatre across the street and then by the public and many famous celebrities over the years. Having changed ownership many times, it was restored to its original splendor in 1984 and bought by its current owners, Camberly Properties in 1995. Today there is a library, a restaurant, a spa, an indoor heated pool, pickle ball courts, and a putt put course! We all wished for a longer stay.



We had a 7pm dinner reservation but a few met early for some libations at the bar. We chose a seating area with beautiful, overstuffed aged leather furniture, just like you would find in a mansion's den. Once all parties arrived, we were seated for dinner. Appetizers and small plates were the theme, given the late lunch. The Baked Brie with its blackberry jam and candied pecans was a hit and gone fast.

Speaking of the Barter Theatre, they run plays all summer long. Opened during the depression, patrons

could barter their produce for the price of a ticket, hence its name. The Wizard of Oz was being presented this night, so a few decided to attend the production instead of the late dinner and gave it a rave review. After dinner, a few of us walked around the hotel property, enjoying the beautiful evening. It was then time to call it a day.



We agreed to meet for breakfast at 9am allowing a more leisurely start for the day. Yogurt and a muffin were served first, followed by scrambled eggs, bacon, sausage, and grits, a proper southern breakfast. Your choice of breakfast beverage was self-serve. We then took one last group photo before splitting up. There were 5 cars left for my planned route through the southern Virginia Highlands, as some had made other plans. US 58 is a major road, but it had plenty of twists and turns. After passing through Damascus VA, an outdoor adventurer's haven, the first stop was Elk Garden Trailhead. This is a cross point of the Appalachian Trail, which leads to Mount Rodgers, the tallest point in Virginia at 5729 ft. It was a cool place literally with the wind blowing and a nice view of the fields beyond. Next stop was Grayson Highlands State Park. Admission was \$10 but the view from the overlook was well worth the cost. The park is well known for its wild ponies but viewing them would mean a several mile hike. After picking up a few souvenirs at the visitor's center, we headed on.



That's when the check engine light occurred. An E46 M3 convertible went into limp mode. It would run OK for a bit but kept going back into limp mode. Progress was slow to avoid leaving him behind. While sitting alongside the road one time, we decided to change lunch plans and just make our way home. Go with the flow we said. Besides, a safe easy route was best for the E46 M3 and the car ran fine after that. I knew of a Wendy's as soon as we'd get on Interstate 77 south. Lunch was simple but good and stories were told by friends old and new. Since home would likely be each person's next stop, we said our goodbyes and all wondered, what trip should we do next?
