Beach Bimmering!



Hats and helmets off to owner RJ Wiggins and team for hosting such a terrific event for knowledge sharing, tire kicking, relationship building, and planning for the future.

The event was really to celebrate all things BMW, with both Beemers and Bimmers well represented. A grand time was had by all.



One of the realities in the world of motorsports is that the knowledge required to keep those Roundels spinning is accessible through a declining number of people whose hair is graying. Or thinning. Or both. Part of the hope for this event was to rally support for those experts who happen to be with us in Central NC. Another was to show RJ that there's a community of people here who value his efforts to transfer some of that knowledge into a group of enthusiastic, younger, individuals with mechanical skills. Mission accomplished.

Things got swinging on Friday night when eight of the faithful gathered for a great Mexican dinner in Clayton. About this time, we got a congratulatory note from renowned BMW designer Hans Muth in Stuttgart, wishing us well. Perfect since his handiwork is so well represented at meetups like this one.

The local Airheads chapter arrived with their portable living room, providing sofas and shade for those who wanted to rest a spell. The local Boy Scouts troop arrived to help coordinate parking and offer

sustenance. They were both welcome additions to the party.

Shortly after that the German Food truck owned by Jake Wolf appeared. Soon the schnitzel and pretzels were flowing, along with some epic bratwurst.

Since this is a German themed gathering, hardly a surprise that we tried to stick to a schedule. On cue at 11am we kicked off a panel discussion with Tony Bohannon and Ted Holtaway. RJ Wiggins and I joined the discussion and based on some quick math we had about two centuries worth of knowledge to tap into! It was a great and wide-ranging discussion that touched on tires, tubes, gasoline preferences, restoration tips, maintenance recommendations, and clear "don't do this" horror stories. 

We also had a panel discussion which featured Q&A with both Sean Beach of Leith BMW and Dan Connor owner of the Bimmer Performance Center. Setting aside a friendly rivalry, they shared great insights into the future and support world for BMW. Both of these organizations provide amazing ongoing assistance to the club, again reflected in their contribution of insights and door prizes. We are beyond fortunate to have them in our community.

The discussion was wide ranging, including an exploration of EV's, the ongoing care and feeding of vintage Bimmers, and the mix of vehicles in the new car sales stats. Whether you're driving an E21 or an EV, both organizations are poised for future support.

The questions were wide ranging and diverse, with a highlight being Dan's young son asking, "how fast does your race car go?". That was a perfect father / son moment, perhaps only surpassed when Tommy found his dad's picture in a recent Roundel magazine. Priceless moment!

One telling thing about changing times is that some dealerships for other brands have rigid windows about what they will and won't work on. More than 10 years old, in some instances, means that an owner is simply "out of luck". Not so for Leith BMW who continues to take on vintage and new work. Conversely the BPC as an independent shop does too, ensuring that we will have great support options into the future.

Phil Antione shared more details on HPDE and related programs. We have a full agenda for '24, and he reiterated the point that volunteer support is absolutely critical.

April Curtis gave an overview of Tarheel Chapter's participation in BMW CCA Club Racing. The event at Roebling Road, in December last year, drew 48 racers and 3 successful grads of the Club Racing School. At VIR March 2024, 85 racers came out. The Club Racing School attracted 22 students, with 5 graduating and joining the field. We are excited about a new event on the Club Racing calendar this October. We will be racing as part of the SVRA/Trans Am event, October 3-6. Tarheel Chapter provides two of the Club Racing stewards – Tom Tice, RULES; Joe Marko, SAFETY.

Jon Strine provided an update on membership in the club. Ours remains stable, with more than 2,800 members state-wide. While a bit lower than our absolute peak, this is really a strong result when many clubs are struggling for membership and support. The many hands of volunteers make for a virtuous cycle in this regard. Many different types of events ensure that there's a slice of the BMW schnitzel to fit just about anyone's appetite! Rob McIsaac provided an update on other localized events from around the state. Each of our 10 areas offer distinct activities off the track, highlighting the target rich environment of things "hiding in plain sight" that we are graced with. From Biltmore in the west to the Outer Banks in the east, we simply won't outrun a target rich environment!

April then handed the hot mic over to Dwayne Mosley who offered a bit of his own perspective on things happening in the club, including at the National level. He then proceeded to present the prestigious "Friend of the BMWCCA" award to Rob McIsaac. As Dwayne noted, this is the highest award conferred by the club in recognition of support and service to our goals. It was a delightful way to put an exclamation point behind a terrific evening program. And was, of course, very much appreciated.

Ray Korman provided his own take on all things BMW. Ray has been associated with BMW for 60 years now, going back to USAF days. He shared some great memories from the early days, including how Bimmers were so rare that drivers would flash headlights at each other when they'd pass on the road. Ray, of course, went on to a storied racing career of his own. Meanwhile, his independent shop near Greensboro remains one of the penultimate places to go for restorations and other work. In a nice "small world" story, Ray's team did the restoration of my own father's last BMW for me, a lovely 1984 E30 / 325e.

That car now has 40 years and 267,000 miles on her clock. In other words, the perfect metaphor for our ... plenty of great memories and experience, barely broken in, and always ready for a new adventure. Life truly is better in a Bimmer. Time to "rock on"!


