Whatever it is, we have a new thing to add to the list of mind-blowing experiences. Make sure a visit to Rick Hendrick's museum in Charlotte is on your bucket list. On August 23rd, a very lucky group of the BMW faithful got the experience of a lifetime on the Hendrick Motorsports property in Concord, NC, just outside of Charlotte. The English language will struggle to explain just what an incredible experience this was. Most of us met at the rally point in the little town of Pittsboro. It was a spectacularly pretty morning, cool but sunny. Farmer Travis Payne loaded up his Clown Shoe Z3M with basil, eggplant, and other things fresh from the vine, and shared it with the assembled crew. Our car simply reeked of the wonderful smell of fresh basil for the rest of the trip. It was amazing, and destined to become pesto when we got home. But that's a whole story unto itself!



Back to our amazing adventure in Concord. For starters, only invited guests are able to partake of this sensory extravaganza. In our case, it was at the behest of Hagerty Insurance, that got 29 lucky club members past security. Thanks to that, we were able to go beyond the public museum and were ushered into the private collection.

To be clear, the public exhibit which mostly focused on NASCAR exploits is well worth the trip to Concord on its own. An amazing array of racing gear from the past 30 years is at the ready to amaze guests.



But the inner sanctum is off the charts glorious. The Hendrick team gave us a preview of what we were to see and explained the "no photos" rule. Sadly, a number of family members were killed in a plane crash in 2004, and some of what is shared inside is a memorial to lives lost. Hendrick's son was one of the victims. It is a somber part of an otherwise truly uplifting experience. The collection includes more than 230 vehicles. There are another 250 in an offsite warehouse. The magnitude is stunning. Once inside, you are greeted by a collection of 1967 Corvettes, all of them "big block" 427's. Turns out this was Rick's favorite year, so he acquired an example of every color combination ever produced. The whole Chevy catalogue is arrayed in front of you. And it gets better from there!

There's an entire part of the museum dedicated to 1954-58 Corvettes, my personal favorites. All of them top of the category examples. So, naturally, all the 57's are fuel injected! If I had a 'vette, it would be one of these. There's a Porsche section. A Ferrari section. A BMW wing. A McLaren segment. A "black car room" that includes a very rare 1965 Malibu SS 396, a Screaming Chicken 1977 Pontiac Trans Am, and a 1966 Nova SS with a rare 327.

Then there's the guitar room, which has over 200 instruments. All signed by guests of the Hendrick organization. Taylor Swift. ZZ Top. Les Paul. You get the drift.

Then there's the first Chevy owned by Rick, from 1932. And a police car from the Virginia State Police that once tracked him down as a boy racer. And his very first Corvette, from 1963. And his dad's 1931 Chevy. Papa Joe plays a big role in the Hendrick story.



One of the execs from the Hendrick organization met us and shared that he was a BMWCCA member. He inquired about which chapter we were in. After we told him he said, "oh yea, you're the guys who put so many articles in the Roundel!". Guilty as charged.

By the time we got back to the lobby, I think we were suffering from a form of sensory overload. Everything was better than everything else. We thanked the Hendrick and Hagerty folks for their hospitality as we headed to lunch.

Oh, but they arranged lunch for us at the Clubhouse at Charlotte Motor Speedway! So, looking out over the front straight and pit road, six stories up, we settled in for some mighty fine dining. The food was wonderful, the service outstanding, and the view stunning. Dinner and a show too, as a Ford Driving School sent a squadron of Mustang GT's out to bang around on the road course. It was epic!

Finally, we had to head for home to try and beat our way out of town before the rush hour started. We successfully did that such that we were able to stop in the little town of Asheboro for some ice cream at the local Dairy Queen. A chocolate malted milk shake makes everything better.

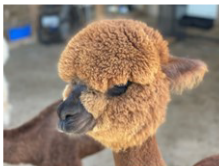


Pittsboro Alpaca Farm – Fall Fun!

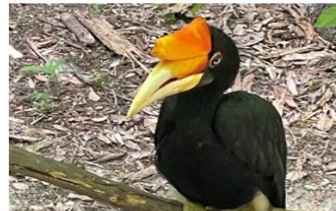
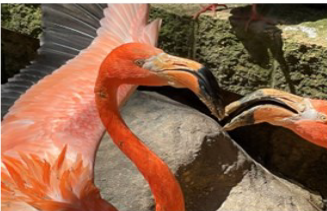
