Fall Mountain Drive



ON THE COVER:

Having owned several German cars over the years, including a 318 and a 325i, and two BMW motorcycles, when I saw a post regarding a weekend drive through the South Mountains and the Blue Ridge by a group of BMW enthusiasts it grabbed my interest. That and the fact that my wife and I have a 2001 BMW Z3 3.0i. I decided to contact Dave Hurwitz and see if my wife, Joan and I might tag along with the club. He very kindly put our names on the list.



When I read that the route included the length of Old NC 18 through the South Mountains, one of the best stretches of three dimensional two lane blacktop in this end of the state we knew the run would be fun. The thing is, we live on Old NC 18 and are very familiar with that road and virtually every piece of two lane for miles in any direction. However we live just outside Morganton, a mile from the rest stop where the Charlotte folks were to gather after driving the length of Old 18. That stretch can be a challenge, especially on Sundays because the sport bike boys have long since discovered it.

We were sitting in the parking lot of Mull School when the first group pulled in. Everyone welcomed us to the excursion, and we welcomed them to our part of the world. After a brief respite we took I-40 West from exit 104 to exit 86 where we rendezvoused

with the second group of cars. From there we drove 221 to 226A, one of the best winding Blue Ridge roads in Western North Carolina with a 2000 foot climb from the 226 turnoff up to Little Switzerland. The traffic is always very light and there is hardly twenty feet of strait pavement from the valley to the Blue Ridge Parkway.

There were many sections of new pavement where Helene repairs have been made, but overall the road is in very good condition. We met for lunch at the Little Switzerland Café which is a good spot for a rest and the food is good.

The group headed back down 226A and we headed over to Linville, hopped on the Parkway and drove 181 down the mountain and home.



Having had several sports cars and motorcycles, I can say that driving the back roads around Morganton is well worth the drive up from Charlotte. They all seem to be in good condition and the traffic is light. It's almost as if the engineers at BMW designed these roads for we German performance car enthusiasts to enjoy. Come up and join us!






