Bimmers Puttering to Pinehurst

An apt title for the story, since Bimmer Drivers to Pinehurst would have been easy a golf pun. And to be clear, this is a town built on the idea of golf and all the fun things you can do in sand traps and water hazards!

For our adventure on December 13, we had 22 of the Bavarian faithful join us for an adventure to explore the Sand Hills region and experience some terrific food / beverage options. We had 14 cars make the trip including one that looked suspiciously like a hot-rod Mini. Hit the go button, of course, and the full-throated bark as the “cats” warm up and the exhaust gets ready for action left no doubt about the BMW heritage cloaked in a British hot hatch wrapper. Big fun, to be sure.

The drive got off to a good start, although it was not without an unfortunate moment when the M2 in our group was tapped by a jacked up pickup truck. Fortunately, no one was hurt and we were still able to make our lunch date, but it highlighted the challenges that come with heavy traffic, distracted driving, and dramatic disparities in vehicle sizes.



The weather for the day would best be described as “perfect”. Bright sun, no clouds, and temperatures hovering close to 60 made it an ideal backdrop for the dining club with a driving problem. The route out of suburban Raleigh led to NC-42 in the town of

Fuquay-Varina. Heading southwest from there, the road becomes a spectacular undulating ribbon of asphalt racing through pine forest and horse farm country that soothes the senses. It also creates an odd, itchy, sensation in the driver’s right foot, which needs to be tempered by a measure of adult self-control. The roads could easily accommodate speeds that are twice what’s posted. Don’t do it! The speeds are decidedly low in places, no doubt part of a local revenue enhancement effort designed to balance budgets.



Still, the route across the edge of the ancient Uwharrie Mountains is stunningly pretty. Relax, enjoy the vibe, and take a long pull on an Americano. Life is better in a Bimmer. The good news is that these old volcanoes are pleasantly silent now, ensuring that the rumble of the X3M40 exhaust was the delightful soundtrack for the hop.

With folks coming from as far away as Raleigh, Wilson, Hickory, and Charlotte, the Pinehurst Brewing Company was an ideal meeting place. The culinary options are wide-ranging and terrific. And, as a bonus, they had many great options for clearing our parched throats after the two-hour cruise from the rally point. Simply excellent, even if we did temporarily overwhelm the wait staff. Nice recovery on their part.

Then we headed out for an extended walk-about in Pinehurst proper. This is an epically cute small town that looks a bit like an Olde English village that

was somehow transported though time and space to the Sand Hills of NC. Nothing could be further from the truth. It is perhaps one of the original Planned Urban Developments. It was conceived of as a sort of Disney experience for adults at the start of the last century. All golf and adult enjoyment options, all the time, circa 1895. The “new” buildings built to look like old ones really are old now, which makes the place even more delightful. So, an Olde UK village but with cold beer and no signs of Blood Pudding. Best of both worlds.



The official history of the town notes that it was conceived by James Walker Tufts. He thought of it as a health retreat titled "Tuftstown". It was also called "Pinealia" during construction stages in 1895.

As the plans for the town expanded it was renamed Pinehurst by December of that year. The name was suggested in a public contest to name a new development in Martha's Vineyard; as it was not used there, Tufts decided to re-appropriate the name for use at his new development in the South.



It being December, the sun began to fade by 3pm, and by 4 we had the promise of a drive home in the dark! No matter, a trip to Pinehurst is always enlightening. Which made a great way to close out the 2025 driving season.



Holidays and time with family and friends awaits. There will be more oil to stir, and apexes to hunt, in 2026. Almost time to roll, again! Game on. In the meantime, we hope that the holiday season is happy, healthy, and provides a great launching point for the New Year.
